CIRCULAR TO ALL THE MEMBERS OF THE PROVINCE

17.11.2017

Provincial Congress 2017:



The Nagpur Provincial Congress of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales was held at the Nagpur Provincialate, from 17-21 October 2017. The Provincial Congress is indeed a symbol of fraternal union and a forum of collective discernment and accountability for the life and mission of the entire Province. The chosen theme “Rooted in the Spirituality of St. Francis de Sales for Renewed Zeal in Community and Mission” found itself to be the main focus of the study paper, keynote address, discussions,

interventions and reflection. The Provincial Congress facilitated the possibility of the maximum participation of finally professed members who are working in India. There were altogether 86 members present for the provincial congress and truly it was well represented by the province. The dynamics of the Provincial Congress provided ample avenue for the members to listen to the reports of the out - going Provincial, Bursar, various forum, perception study on the life of the Province, keynote address and meaningful intervention and clarifications. All these activities helped the assembled members to become fully aware of the life and work of the Province. The well deliberated and drafted statement and the plan actions are the outcome of our listening, interacting, discussing and sharing the concerns and challenges that the Province confronts today, and they truly represent the thinking and priority of the Province. It is our firm belief they will serve as the guiding lights for the next three years in the life and mission of the Nagpur Province.

Visitation to Apostolic Communities:

I had an opportunity to pay flying visits to all the Province Apostolic Communities starting with Jalna-Aurangabad community, with the view to know the members in their place of ministry, and to be in touch with the ground the reality of the Province. During my visit I had the opportunity to meet and interact with most of the members and share their concerns and the challenges that they face, while carrying out their regular ministry. I understand that each one of you is dealing with unique situations and challenges and they demand altogether different responses from you. During my visit I had a common meeting with the Apostolic Community and stressed the important role of the community in our life as religious and how it affects our ministry. The members were reminded that our Founder Fr. Peter Mermier who always stressed that there can be no religious life without community and our life must be nurtured in fraternal communion which in turn manifests itself in service of God and His people. Our community life itself must be lived in and through the common practice of common prayers, common table fellowship, community meeting, mutual respect and appreciation for one another. There should be monthly community meeting on a fixed day and it should be used as an occasion to evaluate community life and the apostolate of the community. Community meeting should have presentation of statements of accounts of the previous month. Thank you, dear confreres, for according me a warm welcome and I really enjoyed your hospitality.

I would like to place them before you, trusting in God and your good will that they will guide and motivate the life of the members for the coming three years.

Statement of the Provincial Congress 2017:

We, the members of the Nagpur Province of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales, gathered at the MSFS Provincialate, Nagpur, for the Provincial Congress 2017 from 17th to 21st October 2017, keeping in mind the charisms given to us by Fr Peter Mermier, our Founder, and having the theme “Rooted in the Spirituality of St. Francis de Sales for Renewed Zeal in Community and Mission” have come to the following conclusions after an honest and sincere reflection and deliberation.

- 1) Consecrated Life in the Community:** As the members of the Province we are resolved to make our community life the core of living as brothers; to dispose ourselves to the Spirit of God placing ourselves as instruments; to initiate a process of a continuous return to the source of our Christian life; to give undivided attention to community life; to keep our community away from unhealthy addictions which diminish our effectiveness as a community.

- 2) **Personal life:** We are resolved to raise transformational questions and seek transformational answers, in order to bring about a systemic change and paradigm shift. We are also convinced of the need to be genuine, loving human persons in our dealing with confreres. We will be accountable to our superiors. We will give importance to daily personal prayer life.
- 3) **Apostolates:**
 - a) **Pastoral Life:** We are resolved to be daring and committed missionaries after the example of our Patron St. Francis de Sales. We personalize the “clarion call of missions” by our Founder Fr. Peter Mermier and we uphold our missionary vision. We involve ourselves in the lives of the people, understand their problems and seek together solutions that will brighten their lives.
 - b) **Education:** We are resolved to give specialized training to confreres for diverse educational skills and technology. We will create a mechanism to assess our educational institutions. We will give preferential option to the economically under privileged. We will treat our collaborators with dignity and honour.
 - c) **Formation:** It shall be our constant endeavour to promote and discern genuine vocations for the Province. We will give undivided attention to all formees, helping them to dedicate themselves in the Congregation. We shall leave nothing undone to instil in the hearts of the young formees a true love for God and devotion to our Mother of Compassion. We will inculcate in them a profound knowledge of St. Francis de Sales, Fr. Peter Mermier, as well as of our various missionary engagements.
 - d) **Innovative Apostolate:** We are resolved to take missionary initiatives and personal risks for the sake of mission by involving ourselves in social and innovative ministries like preaching, inter-religious activities and others with the help of higher studies in secular subjects.
- 4) **Salesian Spirituality:** We are resolved to revisit the patrimony of our Congregation by deepening our knowledge of Salesian spirituality and practising the ‘little virtues’. We will grow in the experience of the love of God as guided by St. Francis de Sales.

Action Plan of the Provincial Congress 2017:

1. Consecrated Life in the Community

- a. We define community life “We are one in the spirit we are one in the Lord...” We will always maintain a cordial and brotherly relationship with each other under all circumstances. We will communicate with each other anything of significance which the other may have to know and may benefit from.
- b. To the best of my ability I shall be present for and actively involved in all community activities, particularly spiritual activities.
- c. Even though one is assigned a specific responsibility, one is obliged to share i.e. to give and receive ideas and suggestions through community discernment.
- d. We shall make available Salesian literature for personal reading and encouragement. We will read together Salesian literature at least once a week.
- e. We shall take measures personally and as a community to ensure that none of us becomes victims of any unhealthy addictions like smoking, drinking, abuse of mobiles and other current temptations. Should any one come to know that someone in the community has become a victim of any addictions; the other members should together take the confrere into confidence and help him to overcome his weakness.

2. Personal Life

- a. We commit ourselves to our personal transformation by consistent commitment to the spiritual exercises demanded of us by our constitutions.

- b. Each of us will prepare a personal daily time table of spiritual life, which will include morning prayer, Eucharist, meditation, visits to the blessed sacrament, adoration, rosary, way of the cross, evening prayer, night prayer, personal prayer and sacrament of reconciliation at least once a month.
- c. If for any reason we have to be absent from the community for a short time, we will make sure that the superior or whoever is present in the community is informed about our absence and the expected time of our return.
- d. We will give timely, necessary and authentic information about our ministries to the local superior and the community from time to time.

3. Apostolates

a) Mission Apostolate

- i. We shall answer the call of the mission with deep faith in God and in our confreres and move ahead courageously and confidently, no matter where we are sent.
- ii. We shall be true to the vision and mission plan of each centre and we shall not dilute it or even modify it except after consultation and serious deliberation.
- iii. The heart of our mission will always be the growth and development of our people. Hence, we will make an all-out effort to understand the problems of the people through our house visits, interactions with the people and making them participators in the decisions which affect them.
- iv. For finding solutions to their problems, we will guide and lead them to the relevant agencies, officials and organizations.

b) Education Apostolate

- i. A committee consisting of experienced teachers and experts shall be appointed, under the leadership of the councillor in charge of education to conduct a systematic and thorough evaluation on a given format of every school in the province once in two years.
- ii. We shall give fee concession/free ship to deserving economically weaker students in all our schools and the data of the same is to be maintained in the school record for reference and reported to the councillor in charge of education.
- iii. We shall treat all our collaborators humanely.

c) Formation Apostolate

- i. A minimum of six vocation promoters are to be appointed for different regions and one among them should be made the coordinator.
- ii. Each confrere is to make efforts to promote at least one vocation to the province and we should not neglect discerning vocations from our families/neighbourhood.
- iii. Be real role models to the formees through your exemplary life.
- iv. Display the name of one Salesian virtue on the notice board every week and give a brief meditation on that virtue in a progressive manner.
- v. Daily reading of extracts from the Salesian literature at a fixed place and fixed time.
- vi. A play/skit to be enacted on the life of St. Francis de Sales and Fr. Peter Mermier on the occasion of the celebration of feasts/ Founder's Day.
- vii. From the time of the commencement of regency every young confrere shall be seriously observed to discern his outstanding qualities, abilities, talents, inclinations with a view to understand the possible field of his interest. This knowledge will enable the formator to guide them in diverse educational skills and technology.
- viii. Send six confreres for formator's course in the next three years.

d) Social and Innovative Apostolate

- i. Send the members of the retreat preaching team for live-in experience at retreat centres at least for a period of one month.
- ii. The team must preach at least five retreats in our own parishes within three years.

- iii. Start a Retreat/Animation Centre and ensure a regular and effective preaching team to run it.
- iv. Initiate interreligious dialogue programs in all our centres.
- v. Register yourself for post graduate studies at the earliest in consultation with the provincial.
- vi. Establish an office under Manav Vikas Program at Divya Jyoti Ashram, Latapara, Odisha and appoint a full-time director to coordinate the social works in the province.
- vii. Send at least two confreres for BSW/MSW during the next three years.
- viii. Call experts to conduct health camps in all our parishes once in a year.
- ix. Conduct one-day seminar in our parishes on child abuse and domestic violence and related topics.

e) Stewardship Apostolate

- i. Every local bursar should have the knowledge of tally and accounting. Those appointed local bursar should join duty only on completion of a course in tally and accounting.
- ii. Monthly tabling of the community account is obligatory at the monthly community meeting and superiors are responsible to ensure that it is done.

f) Salesian Spirituality

- i. Establish a Salesian Spirituality cum retreat centre in our Province, preferably at Nagpur with a full-time director who conducts regular programs. SMMI sisters could be invited to collaborate in this project.
- ii. Send at least two confreres for higher studies in Salesian Spirituality.

Nagpur Province Statutes:

The few modified and additional province statutes are given below.

A.

1.2.6 Provincial Chapter / Congress

Provincial Congress/Chapter is a very sacred event in the life of the Province which all the members or those mandated should attend. Any exemption to this will be with the permission of the Provincial. (Modified)

1.2.7 There has to be an annual evaluation of the life in the community during the Canonical visit of the Provincial. (This statute is a new one)

1.2.8 Spirit of Prayer and Silence

Members will agree to have a period of silence and specify it in the common timetable, especially in the mornings and evenings so that there is the spirit of prayer and study in the house. This will allow the individual members to have their personal prayer and meditation at least 45 minutes daily as prescribed.

B.

1.2.13 Community Meetings

1. Have community meetings every month without fail with an agenda which should include sharing about each member's mission and its concerns.
2. All those who are responsible for the management of temporal goods of the community, Societies and Institutions of the community shall present before the community the monthly statement of community accounts.
3. Members of the community who are in charges of different apostolates of the community should share with the community about their apostolate during every community meeting (This statute is a new one)
4. The Superior is to present the minutes of the community meeting at every meeting and it is to be filed and presented to the Provincial on his visits.
5. The Superior is free to call for extraordinary meetings as and when the need arises.

C.

3.8 Financial Planning and Accounting

1. Accounts need to be properly maintained. Transparency is needed for better effectiveness. An elected finance committee should assist in this area. During the community meetings the Parish Priest should present the parish accounts before the community.
2. Maintenance of the parish community is the responsibility of the parishioners. Therefore, certain assistance in cash or kind is to be given for the maintenance of the community engaged in pastoral work. (Modified).

4.5.5 Service Conditions

Working hours, Attendance and Leave Register, Types of leaves and Rules on Absence.

We need to prepare service conditions governing all the schools of our Province. **(Modified)**

F.

7.3.1

18. He ensures that all the guidelines given in the new MSFS Governance are observed and adopted.
19. When his term/s as Provincial is over, he is encouraged to work in some frontier mission of the Province. (This statute is a new one)

G.

10.2

16. A priest shall not undertake any other work not pertaining to the mission entrusted by the Bishop without the permission of the Bishop.
17. A priest who is considered to be sent for Pastoral ministry must have worked in India/Mozambique not less than six years as a priest. This is applicable for all the confreres sent to work abroad. (This statute is a new one)
18. After 10 years of service rendered to the Diocese, it is mandatory that the confreres sent exclusively for pastoral ministry/fund raising returns to the Province to take up assignment in the Province.

H. New Chapter has been added.

12. Retirement

- 12.1 For a religious there is no age for retirement except from some official posts for which we need to follow the rules of the state administration. A confrere does not retire till he feels, and the Provincial administration thinks that he needs to be given a retired life.
- 12.2 We have a home, Mermier Sadan, as the home for the retired confreres. But a retired confrere must be in a community, preferably in a place where he has worked the most, as long as he can manage himself. He must be brought to Mermier Sadan only when he needs help to look after himself.

Congregational Retreat at Poondi, Tamil Nadu:

The Congregational retreat began on 7th October and ended on 12th October 2017. The retreat was held at Poondi Matha Shrine, Tamil Nadu. The General Curia, the Provincials of India and Africa, Vice- Provincial of USA and the Regional Superior of Diburgarh and the members of the Retreat team were the participants of the retreat. The retreat was conducted by a selected team of seven MSFS Confreres under the leadership of Fr. Mario D'Souza. The theme of the Retreat was, "Walk the Way, Live the Grace." The retreat was well preached with a lot of depth of spirituality. The retreat team won the hearts of all the participants. After the retreat there was a critical evaluation of the retreat by all the participants and suggestions were proposed for further improvements. In short, it was a grace-filled time of spiritual and fraternal togetherness. This Congregational retreat will be preached next year to the Nagpur Province members during the Diwali and Christmas vacations by the two members of the team. It is an important retreat planned by the General

Administration with the view to prepare us for General Chapter 2019. All the members of the Province are duty bound to attend this special spiritual programme.

PIF – PEA Meeting with the General Curia:

The Meeting of the Provincials India Forum (PIF) and the Provincial of East Africa (PEA) together with the General Curia (GC) was organized in Trichy at the MSFS Provincial House from 14th to the 16th of October. It was really an experience of collective responsibility and discernment. Such a meeting once again showed the need, the joy and the effectiveness of working and collaborating. The main concern was seeking and obtaining clarity on different aspects of religious life.
